Re: United Nations Security Council Resolutions (UNSCR) 1267 (1999), 1989 (2011) and 2253 (2015) pursuant to the Anti-Terrorism (Amendment) Act, 2019 and International

Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) (Amendment) Act, 2019

Pursuant to section 43 and 44 of the Anti-Terrorism (Amendment) Act, 2019 and section 3A of the International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) (Amendment) Act, 2019 ("IOEAMA") the National Identified Risk Framework Coordinator has requested that the Insurance Commission of The Bahamas ("the Commission") circulate the following Notice regarding ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaida.

Please note that the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999), 1989 (2011) and 2253 (2015), approved an additional entry to its Sanctions List of individuals and entities subject to the assets freeze, travel ban and arms embargo. Licensees are required to take note of the additional entry and press release. Licensees should also conduct immediate searches of their database and register of beneficial owners to determine whether there is any information in relation to the individual designated by the sanctions committee, including associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities.

Companies must report any "Hits" to the Financial Intelligence Unit and the Office of the Attorney General immediately. Companies are also required to notify the Commission of nil results, in writing, regarding ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaida, and associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities.
