This NOTICE is issued by the Insurance Commission of The Bahamas (“the Commission”) pursuant to section 119 (2) of the Insurance Act, 2005.

The Insurance Commission of The Bahamas wishes to advise the public that **Scotiabank (Bahamas) Limited** is not registered to conduct insurance business under the Insurance Act, 2005, contrary to their advertisement in the Nassau Guardian on Thursday, July 21, 2022.

The public is also advised that when purchasing insurance there is freedom of choice in determining the insurer or intermediary that best meets their insurance needs.

The Commission encourages the public to know their insurer, know their intermediary, and know their policy.
