**Re: United Nations Security Council Resolution (UNSCR) 751 (1992) Pursuant to the Anti-Terrorism (Amendment) Act, 2019 and International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) Amendment Act, 2019**

Pursuant to sections 43 and 44 of the Anti-Terrorism (Amendment) Act, 2019 and section 3A of the International Obligations (Economic and Ancillary Measures) (Amendment) Act, 2019 ("IOEAMA") the National Identified Risk Framework Coordinator has requested that the Insurance Commission of The Bahamas ("the Commission") circulate the following Notice regarding Somalia.

Please note that the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolution 751 (1992), additional entry to its Sanctions List of individuals and entities regarding Somalia, and associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities. Licensees are required to take note of the additional entry noted in the press release. Licensees should also conduct immediate searches of their database and register of beneficial owners to determine whether there is any information in relation to the individual designated by the sanctions committee, including those acting on their behalf or at their direction.

Companies must report any "Hits" to the Financial Intelligence Unit and the Office of the Attorney General immediately. Companies are also required to notify the Commission of nil results, in writing, regarding Somalia.
